

Digital Curriculum Initiative Fall 2025 Faculty Survey Results

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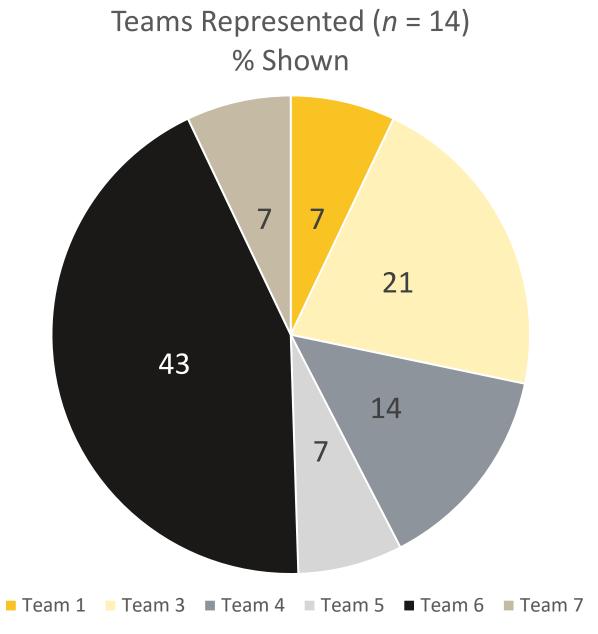
Survey Intent

The purpose of the DCI Faculty Fall 2025 survey is to evaluate whether the Digital Course Innovation (DCI) initiative achieved its original objectives by gathering feedback from participants on their project progression, the overall impact of the initiative on their courses, and their experiences with the program.

This assessment focuses on key goals of DCI, including promoting student success, fostering innovation in pedagogy and technology use, encouraging team development, enabling the sharing of courses and components, and supporting curriculum development through the creation of course materials.

Demographics

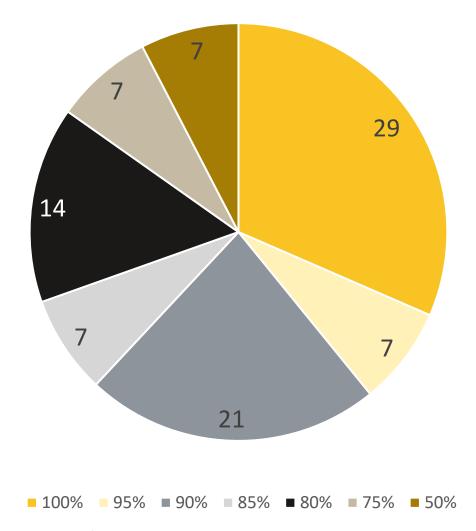
- The survey was sent out to 22 faculty members who participated in the DCI project.

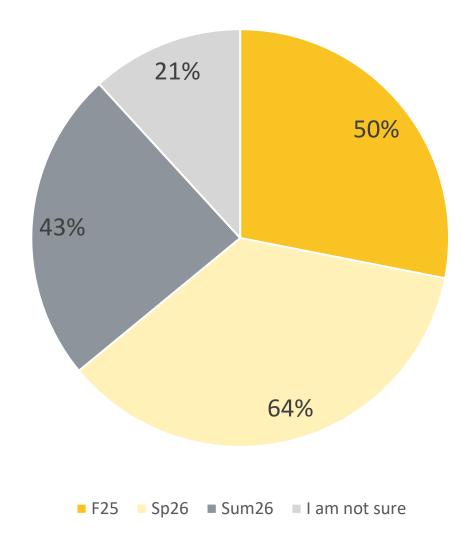

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% Final DCI Project Completed (n = 13)

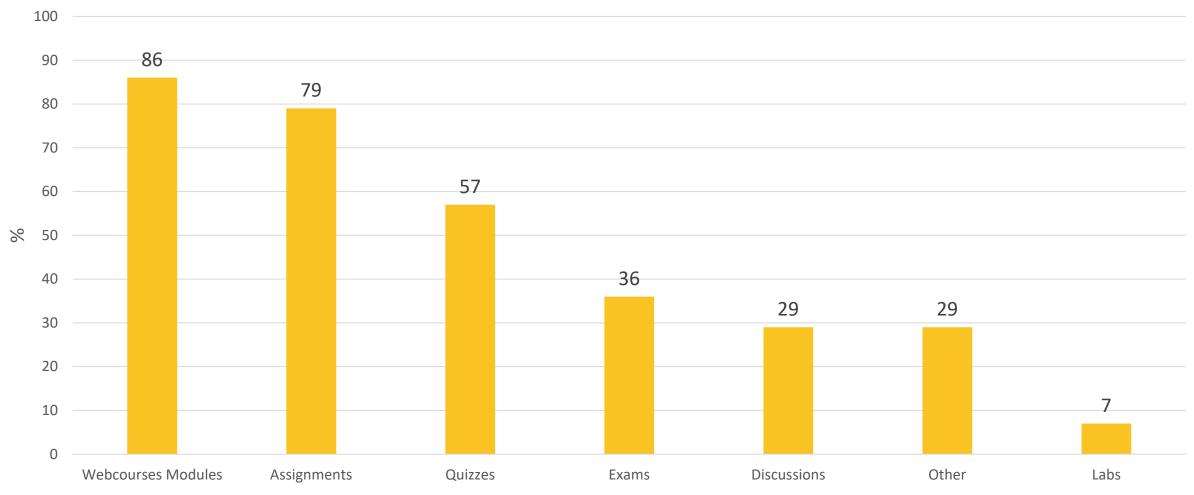


Semester DCI is included [select all that apply] (n = 14)



What course components did you change/enhance for DCI [Select all that apply] (n = 14)

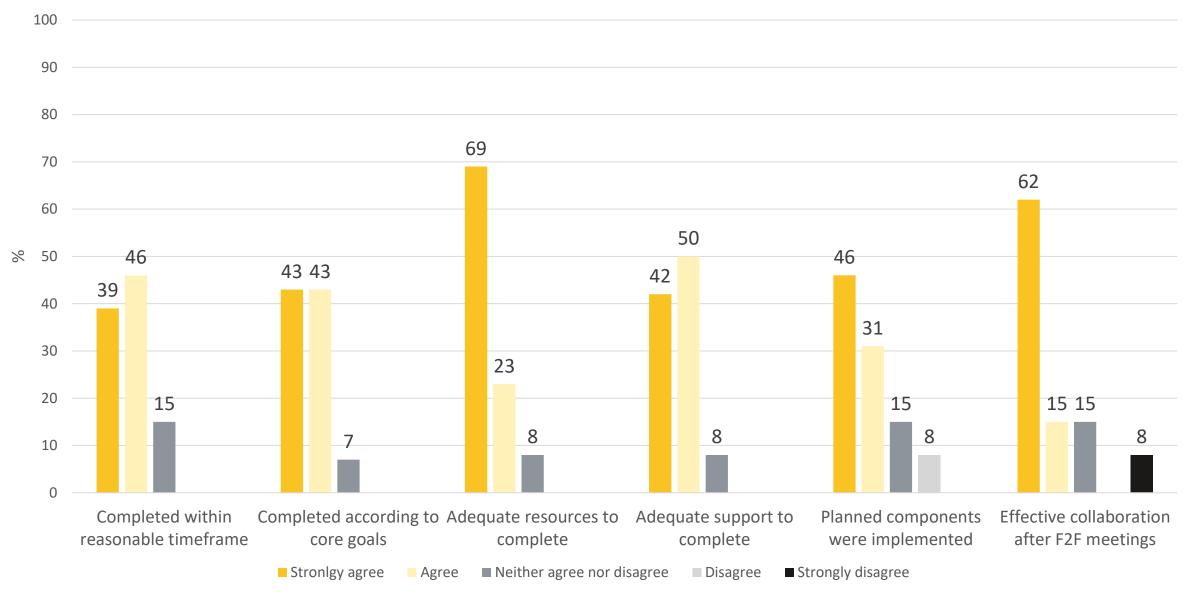

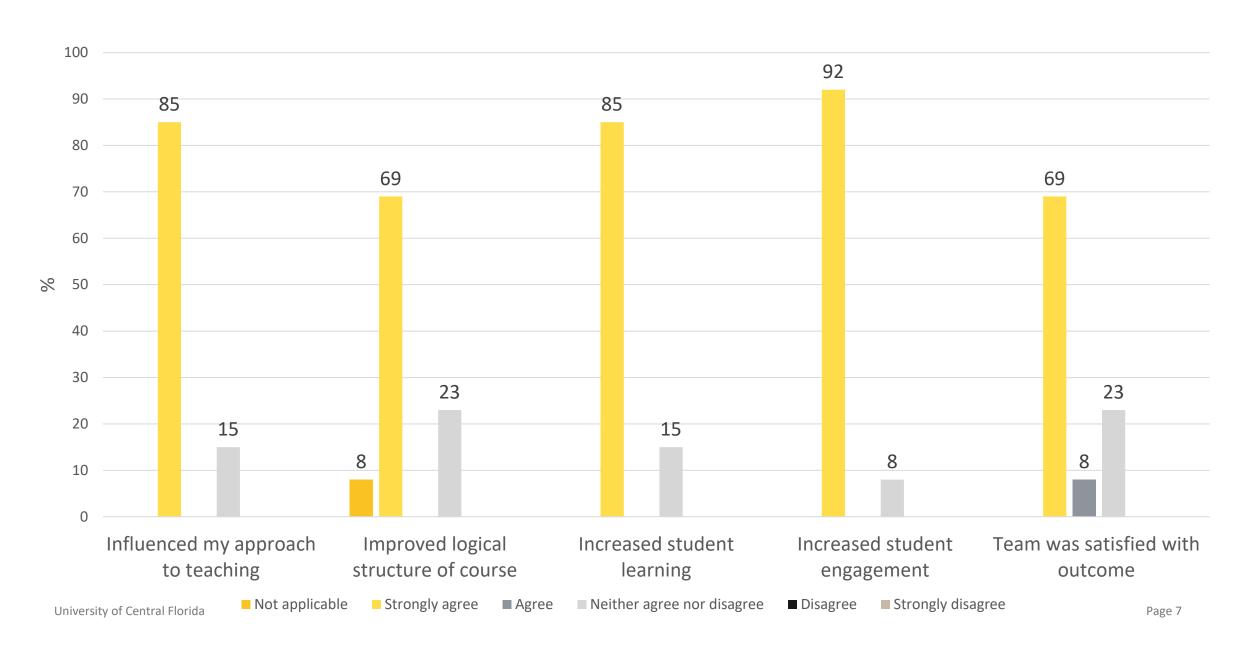

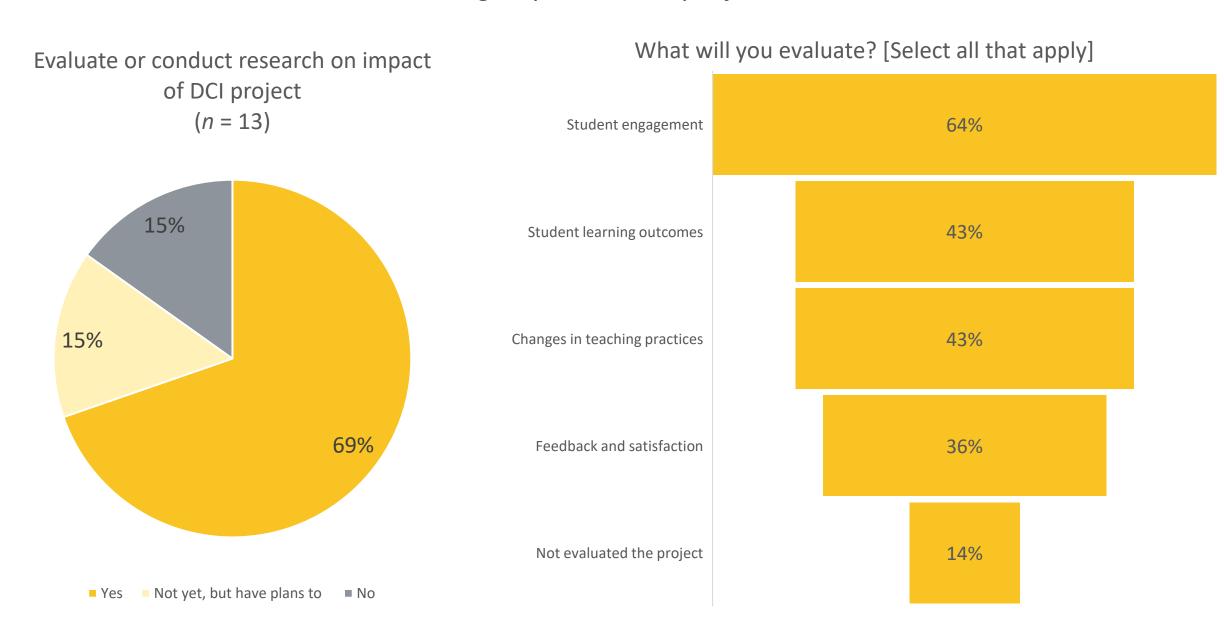
Level of agreement about DCI Project



Please let us know your level of agreement regarding your DCI project



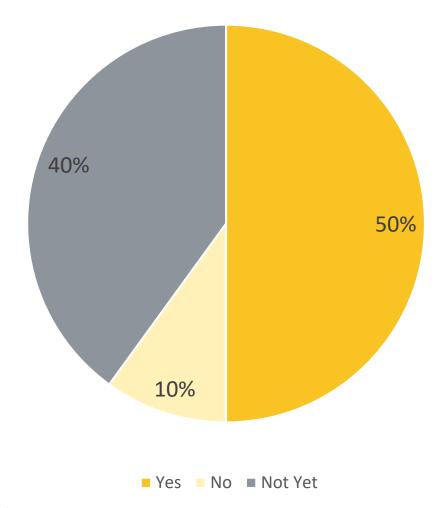
Evaluating Impact of DCI project

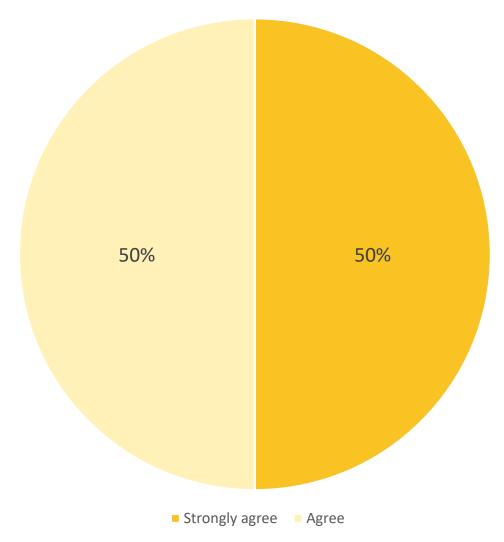
- Multiple teams report that there will need to be continued AI support for integration in teaching
- Multiple teams report that there needs to be improved HIP practices, specifically towards online courses to help with student understanding and engagement.
 - One team who is focusing on HIP courses are surveying to understand student insights,
 specifically student barriers to develop faculty initiatives that is built on student data.
- One team strives to produce their finished content and implement it beyond their own faculty team to share their resources with others.
- While teams are working on continued impact, one team has already won an award for excellence from their DCI project.

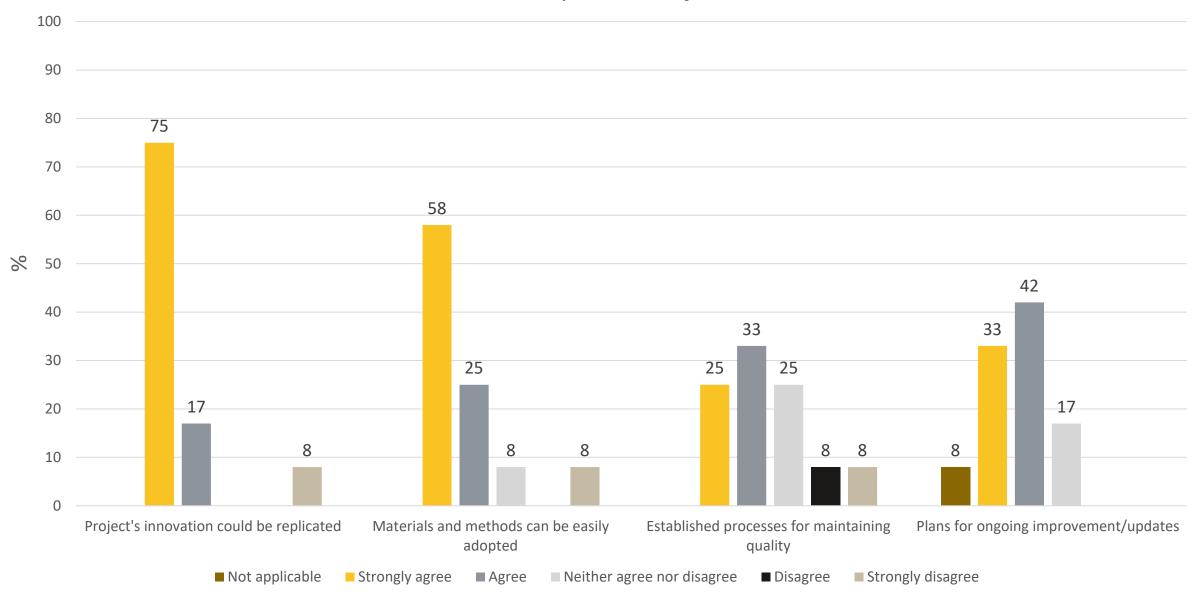

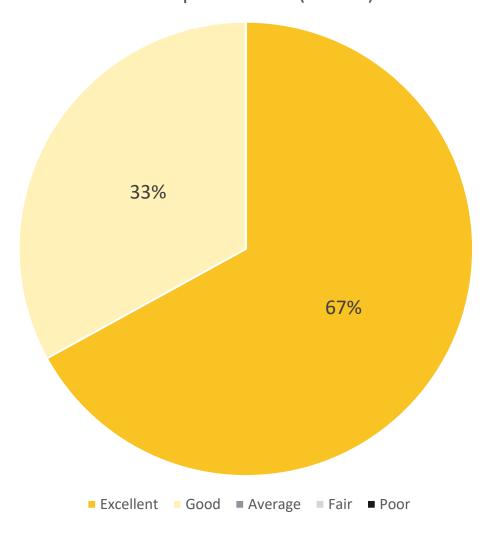

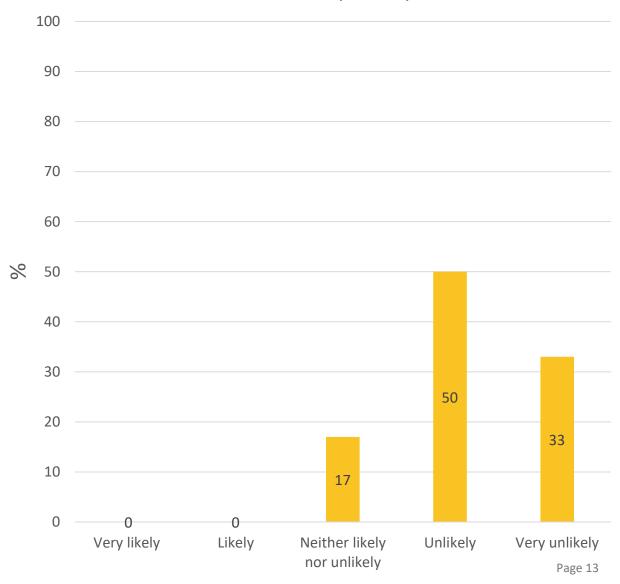
Scalability of DCI Project

- Please share anything we might have missed that you would like to share with us regarding your DCI project and how we can improve these initiatives in the future. (n = 5)
 - All faculty involved must be present and not on professional development leave for a semester of the work,
 especially the first semester of the project.
 - o I would be careful not to let groups get too big--five was too many. Make sure there is a designated point person or leader to hold others accountable; insist on memorandums of progress made and better communication within the groups. I also would not let someone work on more than one project. Being in two groups splits time, energy, and attention to the work, especially as faculty are teaching, conducting other research, and doing service. I know some people won't like this, but no one can do this much work successfully.
 - It was a good experience. Having DCI funds encouraged us to improve PAL content and introduce RS mode instruction for PHY2053 and PHY2054.
 - Make some team work individually identifiable
 - Project needed funding for at least two years

MICRO-CREDENTIALS

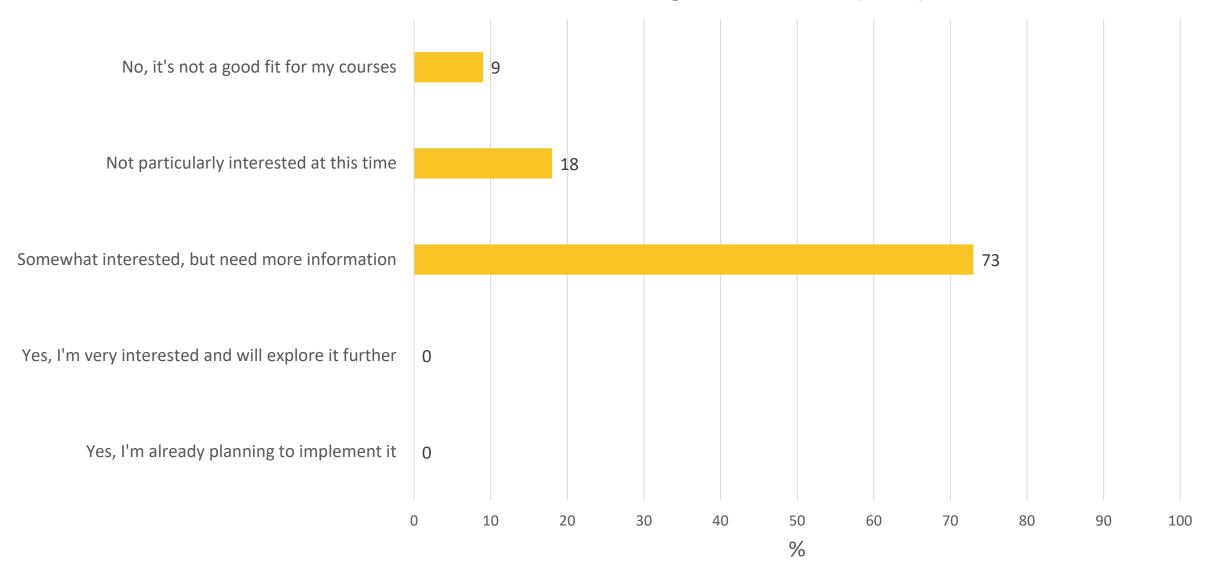
How did the micro-credentialing/ badges offered through the DCI Initiative support your project and professional development? (n = 6)

- It helped my evaluation

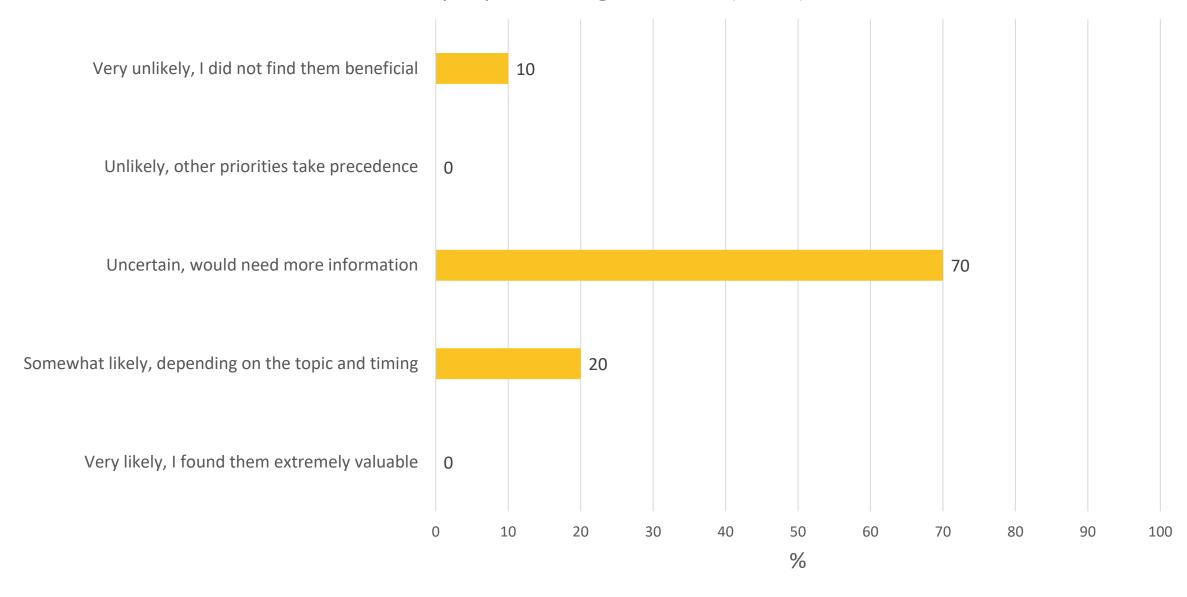
What aspects of the micro-credentialing process could be improved to better align with your professional development needs and project goals? (n=6)

- If we got recognized for obtaining them. Like an awards ceremony for faculty who take extra time for professional development.
- There is no incentive to pursue the micro-credentialing so I simply did not pursue any badges
- They don't do much outside of evaluations.
